Psychological Flexibility Mediates the Relation of Social Anxiety and Alcohol Related Problems

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Alcohol Misuse

- Prevalence in college students
 - ▶ 58% of college students (age 18-22) report current alcohol use (SAMHSA, 2019)
 - ► Full time students drink more than non full-time counterparts (SAMHSA, 2019)
- Associated with negative consequences
 - ▶ Death (Hingson et al., 2009)
 - ► Assault (Hingson et al., 2005)
 - Sexual Assault (Hingson et al., 2005)
 - Academic Problems (Thombs et al., 2009)
 - ► Alcohol Use Disorder (AUD) (Blanco et al., 2008)

Social Anxiety Disorder (SAD)

- Lifetime prevalence = 12% (Kessler et al., 2005)
 - ► Higher rates in females than in males (American Psychiatric Association, 2013)
- Typical onset prior to adulthood (American Psychiatric Association, 2013)
- Interferes with:
 - ► Educational achievement (Van Ameringen et al., 2003)
 - ► Work productivity (Stuhldreher et al., 2014)
 - Social relationships (Davila & Beck, 2002)

SAD and AUD

- College students with elevated social anxiety have increased odds of experiencing alcohol related problems compared to those with lower social anxiety (Mekonen et al., 2017; Lewis et al., 2008)
- Social anxiety positively correlated with alcohol related problems (Schry & White, 2013)
- Social anxiety in adolescence uniquely predicts substance related problems in adulthood (Buckner et al., 2008; Schneier et al., 2010)
- Drinking motives play a role in the relation of social anxiety and alcohol related problems (Stewart et al., 2006; Lewis et al., 2009; Terlecki & Buckner, 2015)

Psychological Flexibility, SAD, and SUD Symptoms

- Experiential avoidance (EA) is associated with greater social anxiety in healthy and clinical samples (Kashdan et al., 2014)
- First year college students higher in EA had greater alcohol related problems (Levin et al., 2012)
- Psychological flexibility is greater among individuals with comorbid SUD and mood/anxiety disorders compared to SUD alone (Levin et al., 2014)
- However, no research has evaluated PF as a mediator of the relation of social anxiety and alcohol related problems

Present Study

- Clarify the relation of social anxiety, psychological flexibility, and alcohol related problems in a college student sample.
- Hypotheses
 - Social anxiety will be related to high alcohol related problems.
 - Social anxiety will be associated with low psychological flexibility and, in turn, high alcohol related problems.

Sample

- Inclusion criteria
 - Endorsed drinking in the last three months
- N = 243
- Female = 179
- ▶ 98.8% full time students
- $M_{age} = 19.20$, SD = 1.42, Range: 18-28
- White = 224 (92.2%), Black = 11 (4.5%), Hispanic/Latino = 8 (3.3%), Asian = 6 (2.5%), Middle Eastern/North African = 3 (1.2%), Native American = 2 (.8%), Native Hawaiian = 1 (0.4%)

Measures

- ► Social Interaction Anxiety Scale (SIAS) (Mattick & Clarke, 1998)
 - \triangleright 20 item scale; α = .93
- ► Acceptance and Action Questionnaire (AAQ-II) (Bond et al., 2011)
 - ▶ 7 item scale; α = .92
- ► Young Adult Alcohol Consequences Questionnaire (YAACQ) (Read et al., 2007)
 - ▶ 48 yes/no items; α = .94

Procedure

- Online survey battery
- Analytic Strategy
 - Conditional process analysis using path-analytic regression in SPSS using PROCESS Model 4 (Hayes, 2018)
 - Mediation analysis



Discussion

- High social anxiety and low psychological flexibility may be associated with greater alcohol related problems.
- Controlling for sex and weekly drink consumption, psychological flexibility mediated the relation of social anxiety symptoms and alcohol related problems.
- No direct relation of social anxiety and alcohol related problems
 - ► Contrary to previous nonclinical college student samples (Buckner et al., 2011; Norberg et al., 2009)
- ► High social anxiety could protect against alcohol related problems (Ham et al., 2009)

Limitations and Future Directions

- Sample
 - ► Clinical and community samples
- Measurement
 - Drinking motives
- Methodology
 - Cross-sectional data prevents any causal interpretations.
- Future directions
 - Longitudinal studies
 - Intervention studies

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
