### **CONFERENCE BACKGROUND**

### The Organisation

ACBS is an international community of scholars, researchers, educators, practitioners, and others who are dedicated to the alleviation of human suffering and the advancement of human well-being through research and practice grounded in contextual behavioural science. Within the community, the Developing Nations Committee (DNC) is the branch that support ACBS members in developing nations in training, clinical supervision, and research supervision. The committee also aims to introduce and develop context behavioural sciences within developing countries that are not exposed to the sciences yet. DNC also supports Chapters and Affiliates located in developing nations by acting as a liaison between them and the bigger community.

### The Organisers

The organisers of this conference consist of members of the DNC and also members from various chapters and affliates within developing countries.

### The Purpose

Two common feedback often pops up during discussion with practitioners from developing nations: the difficulties in accessing international resources due to limitations of logistics and costs; and the differences in time zone often unfavourable to developing nations. As such, this virtual conference is organised with those two feedback in mind. The conference is intentionally priced at an affordable low cost for participation. The novel experimental format of 24 hours is also choosen to provide every participants from different time zone a chance to be involve with the live-conference. Recordings of the events will also be provided to participants after the conference.

### The Fundings

Everyone involved in the organising of the conference do so on a voluntary basis. No honouranium is provided. All collected funds will be channeled to DNC training funds and also to various chapters within developing nations to support future activities within developing nations.

### The Networking

Aside from the opportunity to learn and interact from esteemed speakers, there will also be scientific activities and networking activities within the conference. The purpose of the scientific activities is to provide a low-barrier platform for researchers to share their work on an international level. As for networking opportunities, this is a chance for participants to connect with other likeminded partitioners across the world to share experiences, skills and build friendship.

## Scientific Oral and Poster Submissions

The scientific submission is open to any contextual science behaviour topic that is applicable within a developing nation context.

- 1.The abstract submission for all presentations will be open from 1 August 2023 until 1 November 2023.
- 2. The Scientific Committee will determine whether the abstract can be accepted for presentation, taking into consideration the author's choice of presentation preference.
- 3. The abstracts must be in English. Authors must use the correct forms to submit the abstract for either individual oral or poster presentation.
- 4. Authors must submit their abstract to acbslamicconference@gmail.com. Abstracts received after the deadline will not be considered for presentation.
- 5. Authors must complete registration for the conference before being allowed to present their accepted abstracts.
- 6. Before submitting the abstract, the presenting author must ensure that all co-authors are aware of the content of the abstract and agree to its submission. Authors can submit more than one abstract. Please do not submit multiple copies of the same abstract.
- 7. Authors will receive an abstract reference number via email after they have submitted their abstract.
- 8. Please refer to the abstract number in all correspondence regarding the abstract.

#### **ORAL PRESENTATION**

Each speaker will be allocated no more than 10 minutes of presentation on the selected topic.

#### **POSTER PRESENTATION**

The secretariat will provide the poster details once the scientific committee has selected posters for presentation.

#### **ABSTRACT GUIDELINES**

- 1. Authors' abstract(s) must be in readable English and follow the international scientific writing IMRAD method. Use Arial with size 12 fonts and 1.15 spacing.
- 2. Author(s) must clearly state the title, author(s), and institution. The detail of the authors' department is optional.
- 3. Title: must be concise, informative and without acronyms.
- 4. Each submission must have information regarding the presenting and corresponding author and their email contact.
- 5. Abstract: A maximum of 300 words and must include:
- Objective: the purpose of the study or research question; Methods: study design, sample selection, setting, subjects, interventions(s) if any and main outcome measure(s); Results: main findings (giving their statistical significance, if possible); and Conclusions.
- 6. Keywords: Author(s) should provide 3-5 keywords for each abstract.
- 7. The abstract submitter must preview the abstract and confirm that all information is correct. The content of the abstract cannot be modified or corrected after the submission.
- 8. Corresponding author: Please indicate the corresponding author. The scientific committee will communicate directly with the individual regarding the status of their abstract submission.
- 9. In case of an emergency and the presenters cannot attend the conference, the author must arrange for another individual to present the oral/poster presentation. In such instances, duly inform the conference organisers.
