### Overview

- Contextual behavioral approaches, such as acceptance and commitment therapy (ACT), clinically-applied relational frame theory (RFT), and functional analytic psychotherapy (FAP), consist of principles and processes that purport to be universally applicable to the human condition.
- However, the significance of the sociocultural context, and its functional implications, is not always explicit within these approaches and their dissemination.
- Considerations with respect to race, gender, sexual orientation, and intersectional identity can play a pivotal role in both clinical assessment and intervention.

#### Format of Discussion
